Supply Requirements

Bonus Bag 3 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Quilted Panel *	(1) Boxy Corner cut-off from the Holland Duffle. Note: With the binding taken off, the quilted cut-off should measure about 4 1/4" x 8".
Accent Fabric	10" × 10"
Zipper	8" or longer
Hardware (optional)	(1) 1/2" D Ring, Swivel Hook, or Key Ring

Additional Supplies: rotary cutter, ruler, cutting mat, scissors, and binding clips.


^{*} If a Boxy Corner cut-off from the Holland Pouch is not available, (2) $6" \times 10"$ pieces of fabric (main and lining fabric) can be sandwiched between foam stabilizer or batting, basted, quilted, then trimmed to $4 \frac{1}{4}" \times 8"$

Cutting Instructions


Quilted Panel		The Boxy Corner cut-off from the Holland Duffle should measure about 4 1/4" x 8" with the binding taken off.
Accent Fabric	Zipper Binding	(2) 2 1/2" x 5"
	End Bindings	(2) 2 1/2" x 7"
	Hang Tab	(1) 2" × 4"
Zipper		8" or longer zipper
Hardware (optional)		(1) 1/2" D Ring, Swivel Hook, or Key Ring

Accent Fabric Cutting Diagram

Use the diagram to the right to cut the 10" x 10" fabric square into the needed pieces.



Sewing Instructions




Prepare the Boxy Corner Cut-Off, Bindings, and Hang Tab 1. Use a seam ripper to remove the binding from the side of one of the Holland Duffle Boxy Corner cut-offs. After unpicking the binding, the Quilted Panel should measure about 4 1/4" x 8" (it's okay if the measurements are off a little—the bag will still work just fine!).

Note: If a Boxy Corner isn't available, layer a 6" x 10" main fabric, batting or soft and stable, and a lining fabric, baste, quilt, and trim to 4 1/4" x 8".

2. Fold the 2 1/2" wide Zipper and End Binding pieces in half the long way. Press and set aside



- 3. Fold the 2" \times 4" Hang Tab fabric in half the long way, wrong sides together, to create a unit 1" wide and press. Unfold, then fold the two long side edges into the middle pressed line and press again. Refold original pressed line and press to hold shape. Top stitch along long sides 1/8" from edge.
- 4. If using a D ring, swivel hook, or key ring, slide it onto the Hang Tab. Fold the fabric in half and stitch the two raw edges of the Hang Tab together, 1/8" away from the ends.




Sewing Instructions

Attach the Zipper Bindings and Zipper

- 1. Line up the raw edges of one of the Zipper Bindings with a raw side edge of the Quilted Panel <u>Lining</u>. Attach with a 1/4" seam.
- 2. Wrap the Zipper Binding around the raw edge of the Quilted Panel to the Main Fabric side. Attach using a 1/8" seam just inside the Zipper Binding fold. Repeat with the second Zipper Binding on the opposite side of the Quilted Panel. Trim off any excess Binding overhanging the ends.




3. Keeping the Quilted Panel with the Main Fabric side up, place the zipper, also right side up, under the right end of the Zipper Binding strip with the zipper opening at the top. Adjust the position of the zipper so approximately 1" is overhanging the top edge of the Zipper Binding, and the rest of the zipper is overhanging the bottom edge as shown below. Sew the zipper into place by top stitching along the right edge of the Zipper Binding, catching the zipper tape underneath.






- 4. Keeping the zipper pull at the top, wrap the left end of the Quilted Panel around to the other side of the zipper tape to make a tube. Line up the top edges of the Zipper Bindings so they are even. Pin and/or clip the zipper to hold in place.
- 5. Unzip the zipper pull and top stitch the left edge of the Zipper Binding 1/8" away from the edge, catching the zipper tape underneath. It might require a bit of creative maneuvering to get the Quilted Panel out of the way as the zipper is sewn to the Zipper Binding. Having the extra zipper length with the zipper open at the bottom helps give a little extra room to work with.



Finish the Pouch


- 1. Move the zipper pull into the center of the pouch, turn the pouch inside out, and trim off any excess zipper length. Position the Quilted Panel so the zipper is about 1" from the top fold.
- 2. Slide the folded edge of the Hang Tab into the Quilted Panel tube above the zipper and line up the raw edges of the Quilted Panel with the raw edges of the Hang Tab.






Sewing Instructions

3. Stitch the ends of the Quilted Panel closed with a 1/4" seam.



- 4. Line up the raw edges of an End Binding strip with the raw edges of the side of the Quilted Panel and center across the seam. Sew into place with a 1/4" seam, leaving the excess Binding on the ends loose as shown below, left.
- 5. Wrap the End Binding around the raw edge and tuck in the loose binding edges into the binding to cover all raw edges. If needed, use binding clips to secure while adjusting the fabric. Secure the End Binding by sewing 1/8" away from the folded edge.



- 6. Repeat with the second side of the Quilted Panel to finish all of the raw edges.
- 7. Turn the pouch inside out through the zipper opening and use an object with a blunt tip to gently push the corners out.
- 8. Fill your pouch with your favorite tiny things and enjoy!
